



Community Impact Assessment Report consultation on changing the catchment area of Ysgol Felinwnda

1. Background Information

1.1 The Area

The catchment area of Felinwnda is situated near the villages of Saron and Dinas on the outskirts of Caernarfon, and serves the villages and area nearby. The catchment area is located 3.9 miles from Caernarfon. According to the 2021 Census 1,421 people live in the Llanwnda ward.

In September 2023 there were 49 learners aged between 3-11 living in the Ysgol Felinwnda catchment area, with 3 of those pupils attending Ysgol Felinwnda. This means that 94% of learners in the catchment area (between 3-11 years old) are attending out-of-catchment schools, with 61% of the learners attending Ysgol Bontnewydd and 13% attending Ysgol Llandwrog.

1.2 The Economy

According to the 2021 census, 60.1% of people aged 16 years and over within the Llanwnda ward are economically active, and 0.2% of these are unemployed. 38.3% of people in the same age group are economically inactive, with 2.5% of these being long-term ill or disabled. The type of industry in which the population is active varies in the area, with the highest rate (26%) working in professional occupations.

According to the 'Welsh Index of Multiple Deprivation (2019)', the employment rate of the Llanwnda ward, compared to other wards in Wales, is ranked 1254 out of 1909 LSOAs (Lower Super Output Areas) in Wales, which places it in the least deprived 50%.

1.3 Deprivation

The Llanwnda Ward is rated within the 50% least deprived wards in Wales (ranked 1046 of 1909).

Several fields draw up these general indexes, including income, employment, health, education, access to services, community safety, physical environment and housing.

Nevertheless, it is noted that the Llanwnda Ward is within the 20-30% most deprived areas in Wales in the field of 'Housing'. The indicators of this field are the proportion of people who live in an overcrowded home (bedroom use), and the proportion of people living in homes that do not have central heating.

In addition, the Llanwnda ward is within the 10% most deprived areas in Wales in the 'access to services' field, i.e., deprivation, as people are unable to access the various services considered essential for daily living. The indicators include the average public transport and private travel times to a number of services such as supermarkets, surgeries, primary and secondary schools, post office, public library, pharmacy, leisure centre and private travel time to a petrol station.

There is a summary below of how the Llanwnda area is located in the context of other areas in Wales according to the Wales Index of Multiple Deprivation (2019):

2.1 Context of the schools in the alternative catchment areas according to Estyn Inspection Reports

Ysgol Llandwrog

*It is anticipated that the new Ysgol Bontnewydd building will have a capacity of 210 (Reception to Yr 6) and 30 nursery.

**The definition of Category 3 is a school with a strong Welsh ethos, supporting and enabling the learners to use the Welsh language in all social contexts in and outside the school.

2.3 Schools that children in the Felinwnda catchment area attend

According to the September 2023 school census, there were 49 primary age learners living in the Felinwnda catchment area.

OPTION 1: TRANSFER FELINWNDA CATCHMENT AREA IN ITS ENTIRETY TO THE YSGOL LLANDWROG CATCHMENT

Impact on Health and Well-being	Although 23% of the learners in the Felinwnda catchment area live within 2 miles of Ysgol Llandwrog, as there are no safe paths leading from the Felinwnda catchment area to Ysgol Llandwrog it would be required to offer transport to all learners, as they cannot walk safely to the school. Being in a larger school can offer more play opportunities and participation in team sports, and as a result it can have a positive impact on the health and well-being of learners.	Neutral

OPTION 2: TRANSFER THE ENITRE FELINWNDA CATCHMENT AREA TO THE YSGOL BONTNEWYDD CATCHMENT AREA

Impact on Health and Well-being	As 85% of the learners in the Felinwnda catchment area live within 2 miles of Ysgol Bontnewydd, and that there are some safe paths to school, there will be an opportunity for some learners to walk to the school. 	Being in a substantially larger school could offer more opportunities to play and participate in team sports, and consequently it can have a positive impact on the health and well-being of the learners.	
Implications of the change on public transport provisions	A number of public buses already run between the villages of Llanwnda, Dinas and Bontnewydd, but none of the buses offer transport between the villages of Saron and Bontnewydd. Public bus 12 serves between Llanwnda, Dinas and Bontnewydd, as well as a number of public buses serving between Dinas and Bontnewydd, including the T2, T22 and G4. 	For the learners who live in houses that are geographically closest to Ysgol Llandwrog, public bus (number G6) already runs through the villages of Saron and Llandwrog, but no bus offers transport between the villages of Dinas, Llanwnda and Llandwrog.	Neutral
Implications of the change on public transport provisions	For learners who live in the geographically closest houses to Ysgol Bontnewydd, several public buses already run between the villages of Llanwnda, Dinas and Bontnewydd, but none of the buses offer transport between the villages of Saron and Bontnewydd. 	It is not anticipated that realising this option would have an impact on the provision of public transport. Should the learners of the Felinwnda catchment area take advantage of this public transport provision, the number of those learners would be relatively low and therefore, it is not anticipated that splitting the houses in the Felinwnda catchment area according to the closest school geographically (to Ysgol Llandwrog and Ysgol Bontnewydd) would affect the public transport provisions.

As a result, it is not anticipated that families with young children would leave the community should the houses in the Felinwnda catchment be split according to the closest school geographically (to Ysgol Llandwrog and Ysgol Bontnewydd). 6. Conclusion

The content of this assessment shows that it is not anticipated that neither of the 3 options being consider would have a negative impact on the community.

It is not anticipated that any of the 3 options would encourage school-age families to leave the community, as the learners living in the catchment area of Ysgol Felinwnda already attend other schools, including Ysgol Llandwrog and Ysgol Bontnewydd. Similarly, it is not anticipated that young families would be less likely to move into the community should any of the 3 options be implemented.

In addition, as 94% of the learners of the Felinwnda catchment area live within 2 miles of Ysgol Llandwrog and/or Ysgol Bontnewydd, and that there are some safe paths to Ysgol Bontnewydd more specifically, it is anticipated that option 2 and 3 would have a positive impact on the health and well-being of learners by offering an opportunity for some learners to walk to school.
